(1000 Words) Government Jagannath Mannalal Choudhary Mahila Mahavidyalaya Mandla was established in 1969 by the Mandla College and Welfare Society. BA classes were started in only four subjects Sociology, Political Science, Economics and Hindi Literature. On 09.08.1983, the college came under the government and English Literature, History and Home Science were also recognized and at present also these subjects are being taught in the college. We offer undergraduate program in Arts discipline. The institution is affiliated to RDVV, Jabalpur, so it follows the curriculum provided by the affiliating university. Department of Higher Education, Madhya Pradesh issues the centralized academic calendar for all the higher educational institutes in M.P. The college sincerely follows the academic calendar of events prescribed by the Department of Higher Education, Madhya Pradesh. The academic calendar is uploaded to the portal of the institute. Keeping in view the academic calendar, the timetable is prepared by the timetable committee in collaboration with all the heads of the departments. The timetable of all the departments is also displayed on the portal of the institute. According to the timetable, teachers prepare their plans well in advance and maintain teachers diaries. Theory and practical classes are held according to the prescribed timetable. Co curricular and Extracurricular Activities Institute integrates crosscutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability into the curriculum. Actually, the institution decides the syllabus and college has to follow it. But in this limitations college do its best for above said issues. Some of the steps taken are below</p> <p>Gender Numbers of programs are conducted for women and girl students such as organization of folk dance competition, haemoglobin check up camps. Major gender issues are focused and addressed through the activities like Save girl child campaign, Essay and poster exhibitions and wall paper presentations. Environment and Sustainability N.S.S. promotes environmental protection through tree plantation and other sustainable development programs. Every year, N.S.S. unit undertakes a host of activities in the nearby villages during the special camps. In these camps, N.S.S. organizes various environment related programs including tree plantation, village cleanliness, cleaning of gutters, digging of soak peats, eradication of Gajar grass, plastic free drive, Poster Competition, Debate Competition, etc. Various activities like quiz and poster competitions, invited talks are organized to create awareness about nature, biodiversity, environment and sustainability. Different activities have been initiated by the college to save environment such as Cleanliness Campaigns at Temple places, Bus and Public spaces etc. The cleanliness program is organized to clean ponds, watering plant, Celebration of various days like World Environment Day, N.S.S. Day, etc. The college has taken initiative in Swachch Bharat Summer Internship Abhiyan and Tree plantation programs which are introduced by the Indian Government. Human Values and Professional Ethics To create scientific approach and social awareness among the students, lectures and quiz, essay, etc. are by NSS and other NGOs or govt. bodies. The college takes efforts for integration of ethical and human values through extra curricular activities also. Programs conducted under N.S.S., SVEEP, and various departments of the institution help to inculcate human values among students. Guest lectures on value education have been organized for students. National festivals like Independence Day and Republic Day serve as a platform to enliven patriotic and moral values. Arrangement for internal assessment system is communicated by the college to the students along with its compulsion and efficiency 15% marks are reserved for internal assessment CCE and 85% marks are reserved for external assessment in all subjects. If any student is absent in the CCE exam, he/she is notified by telephone and such students are given a second chance. The mechanism of internal assessment is completely transparent as test copies are shown to the students and discussed with them. They are told about the mistakes which have been made by them so that they may not repeat them again. Sometimes students are asked to check their own copies along with the model answer. In this method the student gives correct marks to his/her own copies. 9.	<p>How does the HEI identify Slow and Advanced Learners? What are the strategies for slow and advanced learners (other than remedial classes) The teachers provide counselling for the choice of subjects/groups at the time of admission and before the admission process. The college organizes orientation programmes and induction programmes for freshers. The faculties have direct discussions with students to assess their learning level. On this basis the performance, the students are identified as slow and advanced learners. They are also assessed during initial classes by asking some general questions related to subject or some other related fields. For slow learners, college conducts problem solving sessions to increase their learning level. They are motivated by providing additional learning materials such as unsolved questions papers of previous examinations and other possible manner so that they can cope up with their studies and try to compete with rest of the students of the college. Most of the students in the institution come from rural areas and tribal villages and belong to schedule caste, schedule tribe and other backward classes. They come from economically weaker sections. These conditions make teaching-learning process slow but the teaching faculty members take extra classes to complete their curriculum. Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Mandla, M.P. has adopted Energy Conservation Policy for an “Environment of educational excellence.” The institution aims to realistically and comprehensively reduce energy consumption, assure acceptable indoor air quality and improve energy efficiency on campus through methods that are consistent with a safe, secure, and Eco-conscious campus community. As outlined in this policy, energy conservation will be accomplished by developing a proactive and progressive approach to providing energy efficient, responsible, and cost- effective operations on campus. Applies to: • Faculty. • Staff. • Students. • Visitors. Energy Conservation Practices: • Annual Energy Audit is made mandatory. • Our Energy conservation practices include the College replacing all tube lights with LED tubes, LED bulbs being the most energy efficient lighting option. • LED tubes use 75% less electricity than incandescent tubes (Energy Star). LED tubes last about 25 times longer than traditional incandescent tubes.100 percent of lighting requirement is met through LED. • Energy conservation practices and eco-friendly habits are inculcated among students and staff through cautioning them about simple things which are really effective to reduce Electricity Consumption like students and staff turning off all lights, appliances and electronics not in use. Raising Awareness on Energy Conservation. • Sustainability efforts, energy savings, and greenhouse gas inventory metrics are all high priorities to a college and more importantly, to our students. When engaging in a master energy plan or energy savings renovation project, there is an excellent opportunity to build student support around campus sustainability. Energy improvements occur mostly out of sight so raising awareness of these projects can hold real benefits, including encouraging desired behaviour on how a campus building can and should be used to contribute to a college’s carbon footprint reduction goals. Rising utility rates are generally a fact of life. Just like inflation, the cost of electricity, gas, and water will go up a few percentage points each year. Whether all at once or over time, utility rate increases can wreak havoc on the operations budgets for the college. Save Energy TIPS being followed are as follows: 1. Activate power management features on computer and monitor so that it will go into a low power “sleep” mode when the students and staff are not working on it. 2. Turn off the monitor when the students and staff leave the table. 3. Activate power management features on laser printer. 4. Whenever possible, shut down rather than logging off. 5. Turn off unnecessary lights and use daylight instead. 6. Avoid the use of decorative lighting. 7. Use LED or compact fluorescent bulbs. 8. Keep lights off in conference halls, classrooms, seminar halls when they are not in use. 9. Use the fans only when they are needed. 10. Unplug appliances not plugged into power strips. 11.
